Delete Ezeelogin users

Overview: This article explains that deleting an Ezeelogin user removes them from the /etc/passwd file and their home directory.

Ezeelogin<u>users</u> can be deleted, which removes their entries from the '/etc/passwd' file and deletes their home directory as well.


For example, We have a user called tony in the software GUI, the home directory of the <u>user</u> tony can be viewed under the /etc/passwd file.

If the user tony is deleted from the software GUI, the user and its home directory will get removed from the /etc/passwd file.

You can delete the user from GUI, by navigating to Users, Selecting the user, and deleting it.
